- Dictionary. If English is not your native language, you may bring a dictionary to use to clarify any unfamiliar English terms.
- Pencils

Note that you will *not* be expected to have memorized any numerical constants.

\* Mathematical Handbook. You will be expected to bring a copy of the Mathematical Handbook of Formulas and Tables. If you are not already proficient with using the Mathematical Handbook, it is strongly recommended that you familiarize yourself with the organization of information in advance, so you can find information (identities, integrals and derivatives, special functions and polynomials) quickly, when needed.
